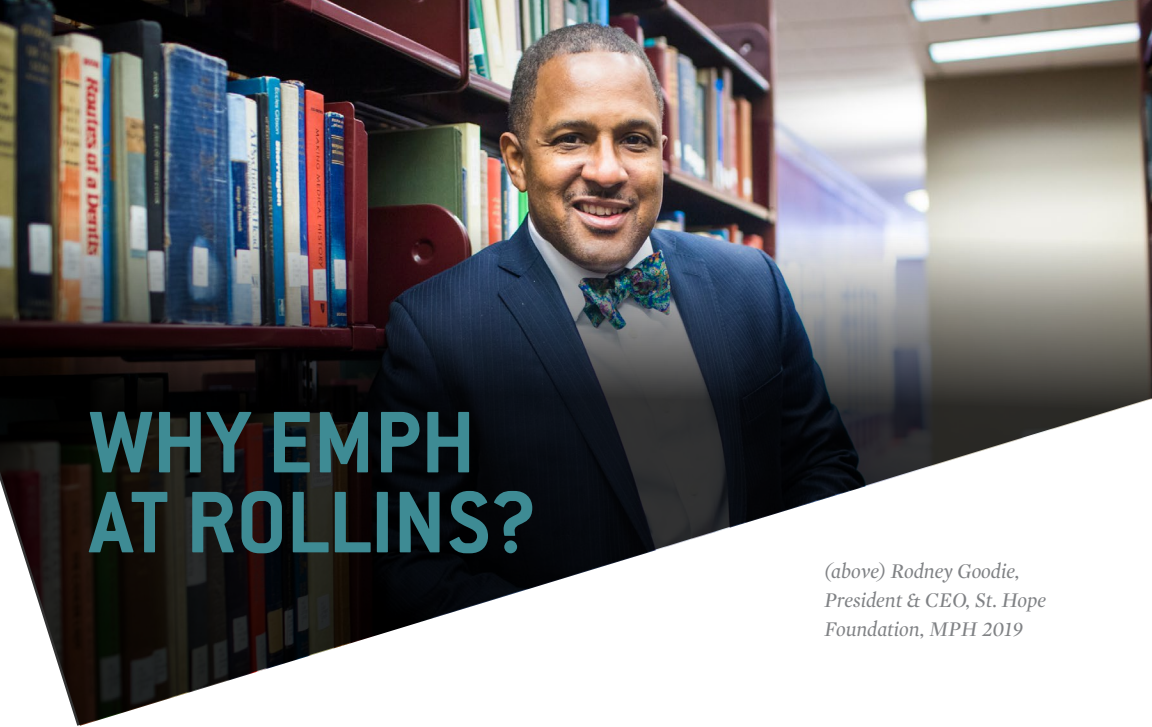

Ensure that technology is successfully deployed to enable public health response, research, and programmatic goals and outcomes.

Students are only admitted in the fall semester. Admission is competitive, and applicants are encouraged to apply by the **priority deadline of February 15.**
