# Hubert Department of Global Health Graduate Report

## Class of 2014-2015

✓ The Hubert Department of Global Health (GH) Class of 2014-2015, with 88 graduates, includes those who graduated in August 2014, December 2014 and May 2015.

✓ The graduation information is collected at graduation and the unemployed are followed-up at 3, 6 and 11 months post-graduation until employment is secured.

✓ The information in this report is self-reported survey data provided by the graduate.

✓ Data collection for this report was completed in April 2016, at the 11th month after the May 2015 graduation.

✓ Information collected includes salary range, amount of time spent job searching and number of resumes sent.

### Survey Respondents' Post-Graduation Employment Status

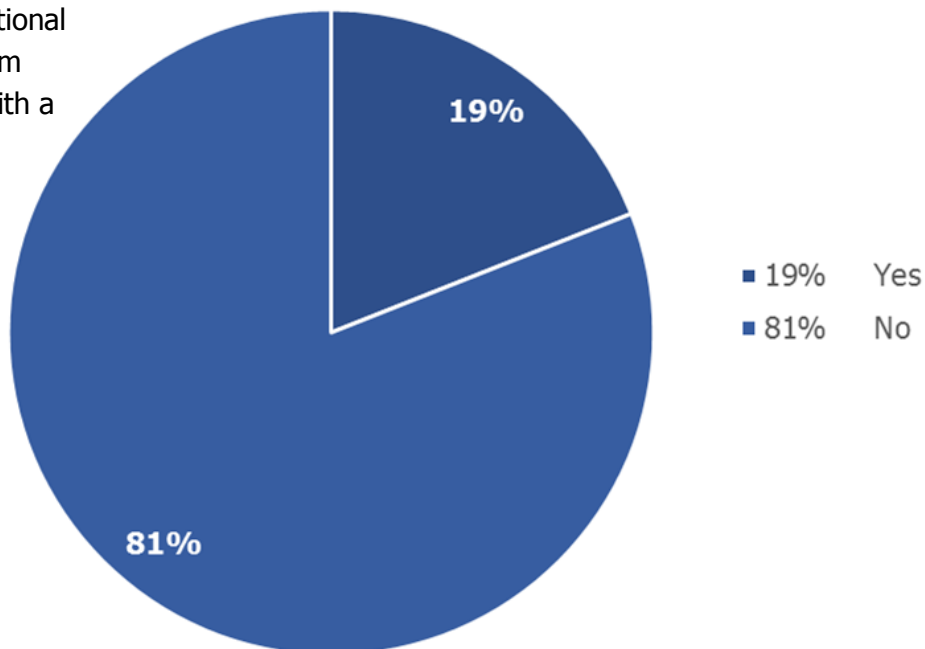

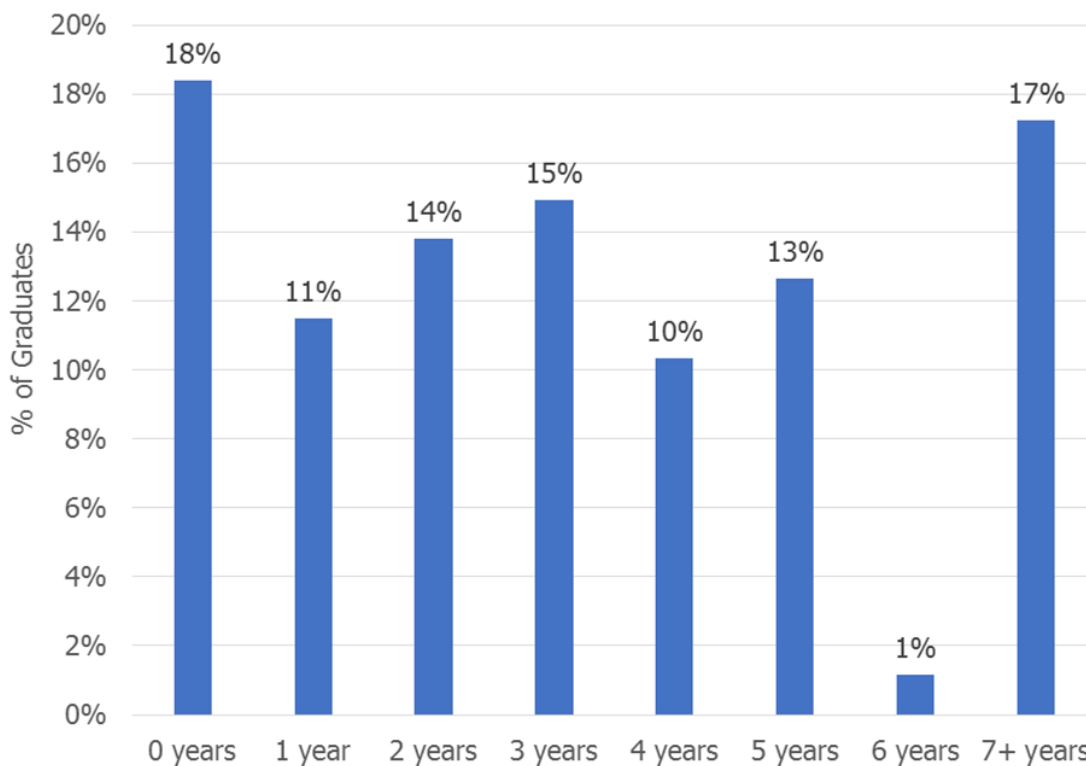
### International Student Status (N = 88)

This chart indicates the percentage of international student graduates from the GH department with a MPH/MSPH degree.



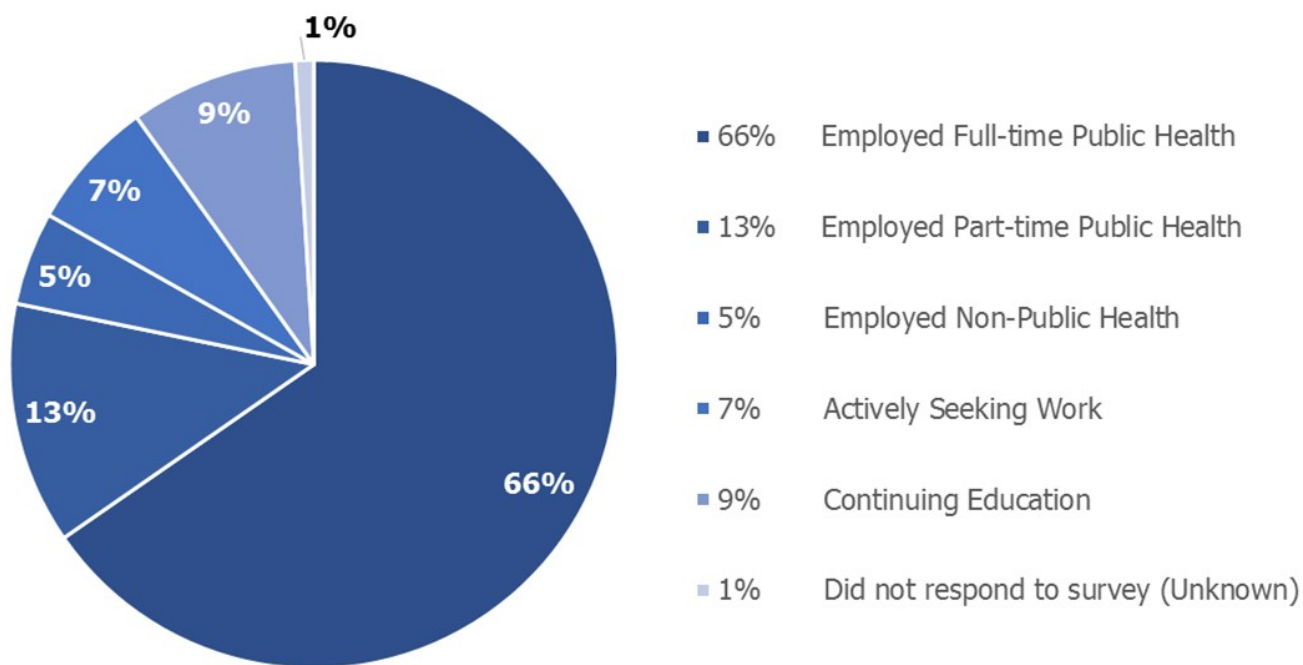
### Years of Prior Work Experience (N = 87)

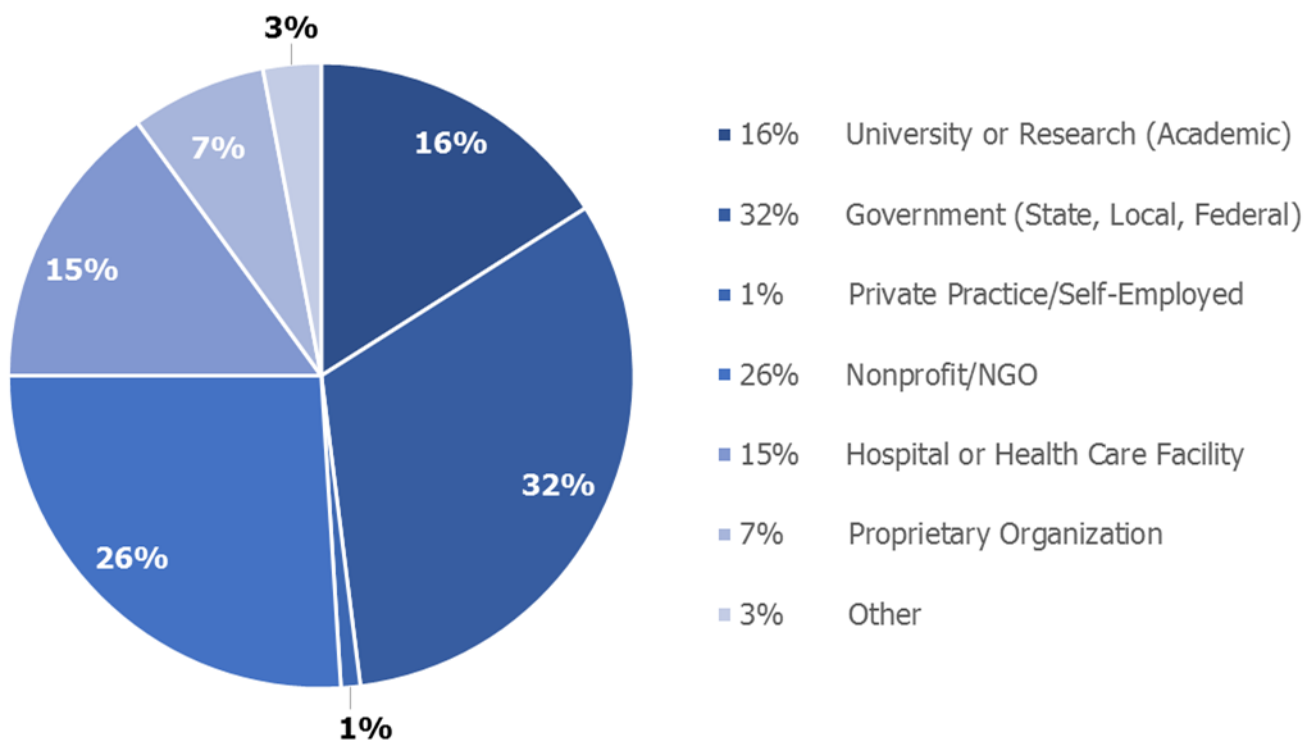
### Employment Status (N = 88)

This chart indicates the employment status of the graduated class of 88 within 11-months post-graduation from the GH department.



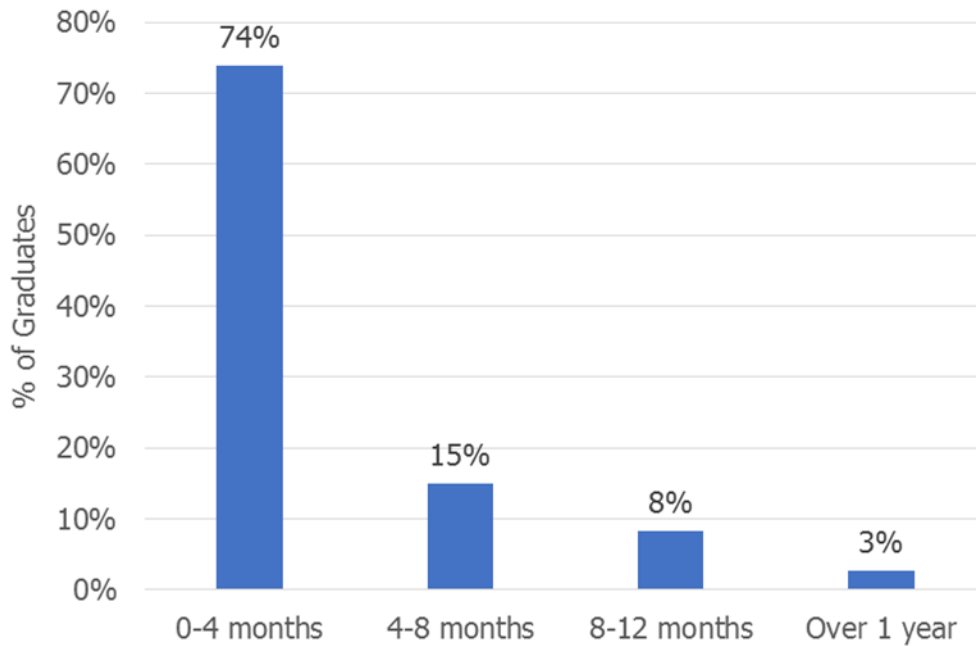
### Employment by Sector (N = 73)

### Job Search Period (N = 73)

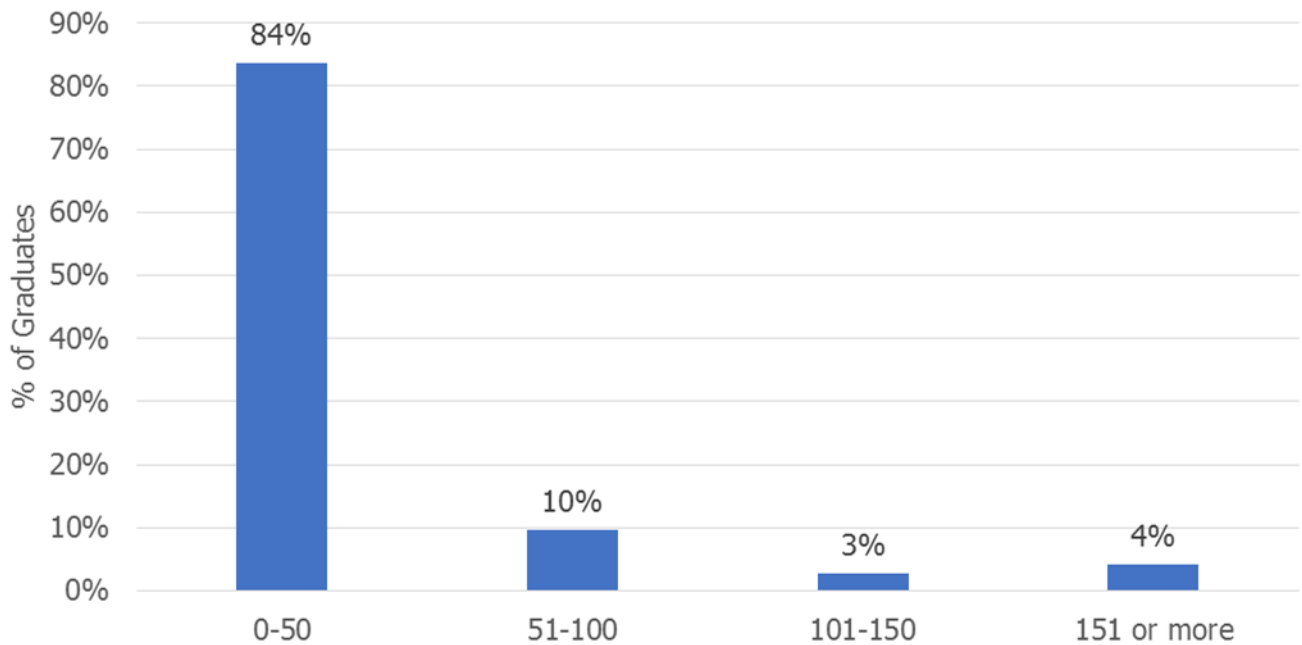
Of the 73 employed graduates who provided information regarding the job search period, 74% secured employment within the first 4 months of beginning their job search.\*



\*Many graduates begin seeking employment in the months prior to graduation.

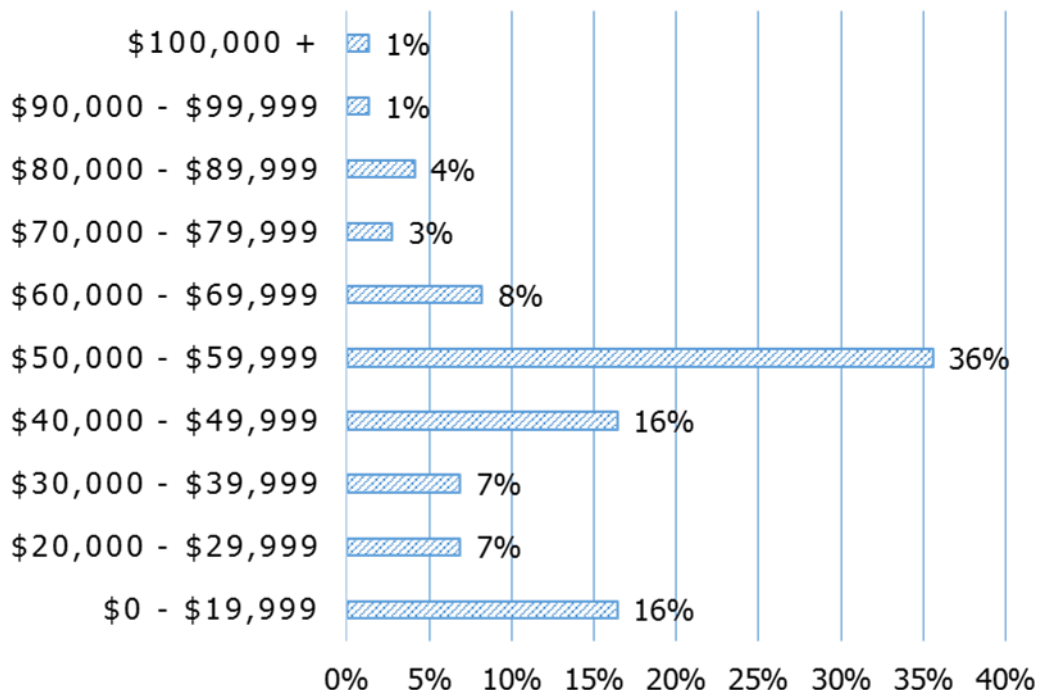
### Number of Resumes Sent Out (N = 73)

Among the 73 employed graduates, 84% sent out no more than 50 resumes during their job search period (average job search period is shown in the graph at the top of this page).



### Salary Range of Employed Graduates (N = 73)

All 73 graduates who accepted full-time and part-time employment reported salary information. Below is a representation of the starting annual salary ranges reported. The median starting salary range of the 73 full-time and part-time employed graduates from the GH department is \$50,000—\$59,999.



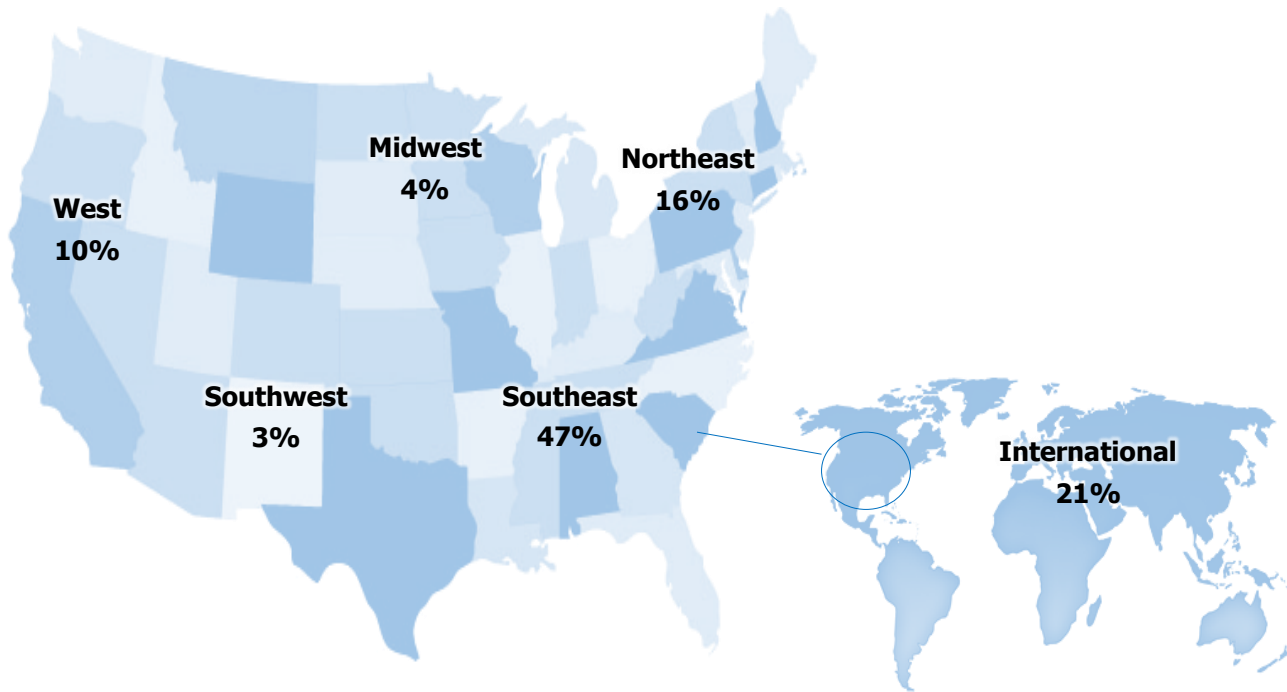
### Median Salary Range by Employment Sector (N = 73)
