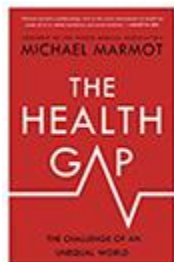
Celebrating 25 Years of Dr. Kleinbaum


